

Resolution Demanding that the Israeli Government Immediately Facilitate Delivery of Humanitarian Aid toGaza

May 21, 2025

Whereas the blockade imposed by the current Israeli government since March 2nd has prevented the entry of essential supplies, including food, fuel, medicine, and shelter, which has contributed to some of the worst humanitarian conditions in Gaza since October 2023, affecting an estimated 2.1 million people.

Whereas food stockpiles have been largely depleted and humanitarian organizations, such as the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) and World Food Programme (WFP), have exhausted their reserves, and basic services including healthcare are severely compromised due to lack of supplies and fuel.

Whereas the lack of aid has led to skyrocketing food prices and widespread hunger, with a significant risk of famine, and devastated healthcare systems, with a significant risk of deaths due to lack of basic supplies, such as anesthesia, vaccines and antibiotics.

Whereas the humanitarian conditions in Gaza have deteriorated to a life-threatening level, requiring urgent action.

Be it resolved that the Executive Board of the Washtenaw County Democratic Party calls for an immediate ceasefire to allow for the unimpeded delivery of humanitarian aid.

Be it further resolved that we demand the immediate, safe, and unhindered delivery of humanitarian assistance at scale throughout Gaza.

Be it finally resolved that we ask for the U.S. congressional members, the President, and the current U.S. administration to pressure Prime Minister Netanyahu and his administration to immediately ease restrictions and facilitate a substantial increase in humanitarian aid to Gaza.
